



Amaryllis Stems

As an amaryllis grows, the stems tend to lean towards a dominant source of light. This trait is called phototropism. To balance growth, rotate the pot, as needed. A large amaryllis bulb, 32-34 cm, puts up two to three stems in succession. Each stem is topped by a fat flower bud. Inside the bud are four, sometimes more, enormous flowers.
