



Daffodil 'Actea'

Narcissus 'Actea' has snow-white flowers with scalloped petals and a small flat eye of yellow, edged in bright red. It is a mid- to late-spring bloomer that is 16 inches tall. Its fragrance is sweet and spicy. 'Actaea' is one of the last daffodils to flower and one of the best for naturalizing. Deer and rodents leave daffodils alone because they contain a bitter toxic alkaloid called lycorine. Foraging animals know not to eat them.
