



Daffodil 'Avalanche'

Daffodil 'Avalanche' is an heirloom Tazetta Narcissus that is prized for its sweet fragrance and abundant bloom. It blooms in early-mid spring. 'Avalanche' thrives in the South and on the West Coast, but cannot handle winters colder than those in U.S.D.A. Zone 7a. The small, white flowers with tiny pale yellow cups are carried in clusters on sturdy stems that grow 14- to 16-inches tall. Established bulbs can produce 8 to 17 flowers per stem. In the South, many know 'Avalanche' by the common name, Seventeen Sisters.
