



Daffodil 'Thalia'

Narcissus 'Thalia' has nodding pure white flowers, usually 2 to 3 per stem. The flower has a light, feathery quality, with narrow petals and a delicate cup. 'Thalia' blooms mid season and is excellent for massing at the edge of woods or in a shrub border. It grows well in the north and in the deep south. This heirloom variety is splendid in naturalized plantings with blue grape hyacinths (Muscari). Deer and rodents leave daffodils alone because they contain a bitter toxic alkaloid called lycorine. Foraging animals know not to eat them.
