



## **Double Pot a Tippy Amaryllis**

One big amaryllis bulb can grow just fine in a 7- or 8-inch pot with a drainage hole. Ideally, when growing a tall, top-heavy plant like an amaryllis, choose a pot that is broad-bottomed and fairly heavy, thus not tippy. When a tippy pot is all you've got, a solution is to double-pot your pot in a second pot with a broader base. TIP: To double pot, use a slightly larger plant container with no drainage hole. A decorative pot designed specifically for this purpose is called a cache pot.
