



Naturalized Spring Bulbs in No Mow Grass - Mark Konlok GBBG/Colorblends.com

Spring-blooming flower bulbs planted into the grass transform a rough, un-mown area situated just outside the entrance to the Green Bay Botanical Garden in Green Bay, Wisconsin. "Previously, this high profile area set the wrong tone, especially in spring, as visitors arrived." says Mark Konlock. "To turn things around, we planted a spring wildflower meadow. The bulbs are positioned randomly, as if spread by nature. Visitors love the effect." Three mid-season bulbs are featured: red-and-yellow Tulipa 'Tinka', cobalt blue Muscari armeniacum and yellow Narcissus 'Hawera'. After bloom, the slender bulb leaves die back discreetly, blending into the grass.
