A late spring bloom combination at Green Bay Botanical Garden pairs the bulb flower Allium 'Mount Everest' with two perennials, yellow Baptisia 'Lemon Meringue' and black-crimson Paeonia 'Thunderbolt' (tree peony). GBBG Director of Horticulture Mark Konlock says, "The flowers are quite different in form and color, but surprisingly pleasing in combination due to subtle repetition of the yellow color of the baptisia flowers and the anthers of the peonies and the alliums.
