



Potted Up, Amaryllis Bulb and Begonia

Winter windowsill gardeners know that potted plants are fun to grow and decorative, too. Here, hand-painted pots in different sizes are planted with a large amaryllis bulb and a begonia. To grow amaryllis bulbs indoors in winter: plant one bulb in a 7- or 8-inch diameter pot with drainage holes. Add potting soil, while positioning the bulb so the top third ("neck and shoulders") is above the soil line. Once watered in, an amaryllis bulb takes its time before starting to grow.
