



Snowdrops, Galanthus

Snowdrops (*Galanthus*) are the earliest spring-blooming bulb flower to bloom. Their pendulous white, winged flowers emerge in late winter so it is not unusual to see them capped by snow. Snowdrops naturalize when planted in rich, well-drained soil. Deer and rodents leave snowdrops alone because they contain a bitter toxic alkaloid called lycorine. They are deer and rodent proof.
