



## **'Constance Spry'**

David Austin English Climbing Rose 'Constance Spry' has deeply-cupped, luminous mid-pink flowers and a heady, strong myrrh fragrance. It was David Austin's first English Rose, introduced in 1961 and still widely grown today. Unlike all subsequent English Roses which repeat bloom, 'Constance Spry' flowers just once per season, in early summer. The large flowers have approximately 40 petals. The growth is very strong, up to 20 feet, with large leaves and many thorns. RHS "Award of Garden Merit." (David Austin 1961, Ausfirst).
