



'Kew Gardens'

David Austin English Rose 'Kew Gardens' has small, single, white flowers that are held in very large heads in a look reminiscent of hydrangeas. The buds are soft apricot. It is extremely healthy, nearly thornless and produces masses of white blooms, lending the bush the appearance of being covered with snow. It repeat blooms almost continuously from early summer till frost. RHS "Award of Garden Merit." (David Austin 2009, Ausfence). Companion plants: white-plumed *Persicaria polymorpha* and *Astrantia*.
