



'Lady of Shalott'

David Austin English Rose 'Lady of Shalott' has beautiful coppery-orange flowers. The flower buds are orange-red. The large, chalice-shaped flower has 60 loosely-arranged petals that are salmon pink on top with a golden-yellow underside. The warm Tea fragrance has pleasing hints of spiced apple and cloves. This is a large, bushy shrub with slightly arching stems and attractive foliage. Grows to 5 feet tall by 4 feet wide. RHS "Award of Garden Merit." (David Austin 2009, Ausnyson). Late season companion plant: blue Aster × frikartii 'Mönch'.
